



## **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

- 1) If accurate weights of the various PCB waste types for pick up and disposal are not provided by the Generator (customer), a quote is based on "estimated" weights using well-established criteria in the PCB Disposal industry.
- 2) PCB Disposal indemnifies and saves harmless the Generator from the time PCB Disposal arrives on site to do the removal of the wastes until the wastes are destroyed.
- 3) Prior to removal of PCBs from a site, the Generator must register PCB wastes (waste class 243-D solids and/or liquids) on line at the Ontario Ministry of the Environment's (MOE's) HWIN (Hazardous Waste Information Network). *As part of PCB Disposal service package, we will assist the Generator with this waste registration exercise.*
- 4) If more than 50 litres of PCB-contaminated liquids are to be removed from a Generator's site, the Generator must first obtain a letter from the local MOE office referred to as "Director's Instructions". *As part of PCB Disposal service package, we will assist the Generator in obtaining Director's Instructions.*
- 5) Prior to executing a disposal contract, the Generator will be named as additionally insured for \$12,000,000 under PCB Disposal's various insurance policies that cover Environmental Impairment, Comprehensive, Automobile and Errors and Omissions insurance.
- 6) PCB Disposal will label all PCB equipment and drums prior to their removal from a Generator's site. All wastes will be secured properly in the transportation vehicle and UN2315 placards will be placed on each side of the truck.
- 7) Two copies of Transportation of Dangerous Goods manifest will be left with on-site personnel. It will need to be signed by the "Generator" or an authorized representative. One copy will be sent to the MOE office in Toronto and one is to be retained by the Generator.
- 8) A copy of the manifest will be sent back to the Generator from the receiving facility as a record of confirmation that the waste arrived safely.
- 9) A "Certificate of Destruction" will be issued when the waste has been destroyed in accordance with applicable federal and provincial regulations.
- 10) Invoice is net 30 days with 2% charged on overdue accounts
- 11) The final invoice is based on actual weights following weighing of wastes received at the Transfer Station.
- 12) A written confirmation of the weights of each PCB waste type will be provided with the final invoice.
